Our exhibitors engage the public by showing what it means to really make something—teaching techniques, showcasing tools, and demonstrating both the perfect and not-so-perfect products of their labor.

- Special recognition during the Faire as a young maker.

What do Adult Helpers of Young Makers do?

Young Makers who apply must also have an adult manager responsible for the coordination and supervision of their participation up to and throughout the Maker Faire.

The adult manager must be willing to:

- Coordinate and manage the needs of the Young Maker(s) with the Young Maker Faire
 Coordinator as the main contact for the group, ensuring that projects are completed on time and meet the requirements necessary for exhibition.
- Arrange transportation and attendance for the Faire and ensure shifts are filled by adults and children who can manage behavior during exhibition time.
